



## Supplies

### For individual study

You really need very little to do a SPS study. You don't even have to have playing cards. Any surface you choose to work on will suffice. But if you want a suggestion for some basic supplies, we suggest the **SPS Starter Kit** listed below.

### For a group study

If you are doing a small group study, you only need a very basic set of supplies. Instead of providing everything yourself, you can also ask your participants to bring a pair of scissors and a glue stick. Besides that, you will only need what's listed below in the **SPS Starter Kit**. At the first meeting, pass out the **Full House of Supply Ideas** below and have participants bring whatever they have to share with the group the next time you meet. Everyone usually has some sort of tools or ephemera they are willing to share.

**A small warning.** Don't accumulate so many supplies that they become a distraction to the study. Sometimes you may need something like a brad or a piece of gold ribbon, but usually a magazine and some colored paper is all you'll ever need. Don't lose focus of the study and what it's teaching you.

### SPS Starter Kit

bible (you can also access scripture on-line)  
pencil/pen  
glue stick  
scissors  
old magazines  
playing cards (old or new)  
package of multi-color paper

### Where to buy supplies

Most everything in the **SPS Starter Kit** can be purchased at a super store, dollar store, craft store or office supply store.

I buy scissors, glitter glue, Sharpies and glue sticks at Wal-mart. You can also buy items individually or in bulk.

The dollar store has playing cards, usually 2 decks for \$1.

I typically do not buy anything at the office or craft store because their prices are higher (unless you can get a coupon).
